### **YOUR LETTER DATED OCTOBER 17**

We refer to your letter dated 18 October 2007.

During the last three months, SNG, CNEV and the other Challengers have worked diligently to address the issues raised by GGYC in a productive manner. We have recently modified the Protocol to address GGYCG concerns. SNG has further offered to the Challenging Competitors to select the displacement of the boat within a range of 23 to 27 tons to address the untrue allegation that Alinghi had already designed its boat for the 33rd Cup.

It is very disappointing to see that GGYC has responded to SNG numerous concessions with a list of issues, including new issues that can only bring into question GGYC willingness and sincerity to settle this matter before the hearing scheduled for the 22nd of this month.

It appears that in this process, only SNG is making concessions and that every time SNG makes one step in GGYC direction, GGYC adds new queries and demands. It now appears that BOR and GGYC are just intent on using their lawsuit and financial power to destabilize the Challenging Competitors and bully their way into dictating the Cup. As you know, SNG is determined to make the 33rd America's Cup a great sailing contest, not a competition about litigation money.
